NJ Transit Senior Discount/Reduced Fare

Seniors age 62 years or people who have been determined disabled are eligible to pay no more than one-half the regular one way fare on all intrastate bus and rail routes and most interstate bus and rail routes into adjacent states. (Or you can use your Medicare card to get a discount!)

E-ZPass Discount for Seniors

Drivers age 65 and over with an EZPass can receive a discount off the full fare off-peak toll on the New Jersey Turnpike and Garden State Parkway

SHIP Medicare Counseling

Trained SHIP Counselors can help Medicare beneficiaries make informed decisions which can save you money. Counselors will see if you qualify for benefits such as the Low Income Subsidy (LIS/Extra Help), the Medicare Savings Programs, or the PAAD program to save money on prescriptions.

Phone

If it's been a while since you've signed up for telephone service you might be able to save! Call your phone company and ask how to lower your bill, or shop around to different companies. Many people also have chosen to disconnect their landline and just use a cell phone, and many companies offer cheap plans for basic cell service.

Entertainment

Cut or Eliminate your Cable Bill: Many people have cut off their cable service and instead watch their favorite shows over the internet or with an antenna. For these options, visit an electronics store to find out what you will need. If you want to keep your cable, many cable companies now offer cheaper plans, so call your provider to ask how you can reduce your bill.

National Parks Pass

Sign up at a National Park or www.nps.gov

Seniors age 62 and over can purchase a \$20 annual pass or \$80 lifetime pass which provides access to parks and public lands nationwide.

NJ State Parks Senior Citizen Pass

NJ residents age 62 + get a free lifetime pass and free admission to NJ State Parks.
