A Regular Meeting of the Mayor and Council of the Borough of Park Ridge was called to order at the above time, place and date.

Mayor Misciagna Reads Compliance Statement, as required by Open Public Meeting Act, P.L. 1975, Chapter 231.

Mayor Misciagna: As most people know, this year Park Ridge will be celebrating our 125<sup>th</sup> Anniversary. We are going to have a number of events planned during the course of the year. Councilmember Mintz came up with a great idea. Before every meeting we are going to highlight a historical figure of Park Ridge or somebody who has done something out of the ordinary. What I am going to read is something that former Councilmember Oppelt was very instrumental in doing – was honoring Jedh C. Barker. We put a monument up by the Train Depot and we all worked together and came up with a plaque to give an outline of what Jedh Colby Barker was all about:

### Jedh Colby Barker - Beloved son of Park Ridge.

Jedh was born in Franklin, New Hampshire and at the age of six, moved to Park Ridge. Jedh's unusual name spelling of his first name was the result of his father George C. Barker's service in the Marine Corps during World War I. His father combined the first letter of each of his best friends' first name, from the War to spell out Jedh's name.

As a young boy, Jedh enjoyed fishing at the Woodcliff Lake Reservoir and camping in the Glen. He spent many days with his friends exploring the woods at Colony and at The Bear's Nest. He played youth baseball for Park Ridge and later helped coach his younger brother John's baseball and football teams. During his years at Park Ridge High School, he distinguished himself in team sports, including football and baseball, serving as the Co-Captain of the baseball and the football team in his senior year.

He also played on the basketball team all four years and ran track for more than two years.

Jedh graduated from Park Ridge High School in 1964. This is the quote in his yearbook: "Jedh, most athletic senior, ladies' man, loves to have a good time". Those words were next to Jedh's photo in the Park Ridge High School's 1964 yearbook. He attended Fairleigh Dickinson University and then Missouri State College until May of 1966. On June 20, 1966, he enlisted in the United States Marine Corps Reserve and later enlisted in the regular Marine Corps in October of 1966. Less than a year later, Lance Corporal, Jedh Colby Barker, United States Marine Corps Company F, 2nd Battalion, 4th Marines, 3rd Marine Division was serving in Vietnam. On September 21, 1967, he threw himself on a hand granted to save his fellow Marines and, although gravely injured, crawled to the side of a wounded comrade and administered first aid before succumbing to his wounds. In 1969, in a White House ceremony, Jedh's family was presented with the Congressional Medal of Honor, the highest honor that could be bestowed upon a United States citizen. The final sentence in this Citation reads: "He gallantly gave his life for his country. He will be forever remembered by those who knew him as a beloved son and brother, a team player, a loyal friend, and to all who knew of his sacrifice, a HERO in the truest sense of the word".

I couldn't think of a better person to highlight in our first meeting. The Barker family and the Lewis family are prominent in town. Actually, Jedh's nephew, Zach, has just qualified for the State Tournament this year in Atlantic City. So, he has a very good chance of medaling and hopefully bringing back a gold.

We are going to do this every meeting and I will be trying to focus on different individuals. Thank you.

### PUBLIC PRIVILEGE OF THE FLOOR:

Mayor Misciagna asks if anyone present wishes to be heard on any matter.

Upon recognition by the Mayor, the person shall proceed to the floor and give his/her name and address in an audible tone of voice for the records. Unless further time is granted by the Council, <u>he/she shall limit his/her statement to five (5) minutes</u>. Statements shall be addressed to the Council as a body and not to any member thereof. No person, other than the person having the floor, shall be permitted to enter into any discussion, without recognition by the Mayor.

#### Speaker #1 – Randi Oppelt – 4 Rivervale Road:

Stated she is concerned about the amount of money that is spent on various parties in town. Mr. Metzdorf told me that it is the Council's goal to save money where ever they can. In the past, I heard they have tried to budget to get rid of the "nice to have things" and keep the "need to have things". My calculations come to an amount of \$50,000.00+ which is spent to honor the volunteers in the town. She stated that she feels they should be honored in some way, just not at such elaborate venues. After watching PKRG video, she noted that the seniors in town are also honored for their "years of residency". She feels only a minimal number attend these dinners four times a year and at a large expense.

After expressing her concerns she gave a few suggestions on reducing the costs. Her proposal was instead of these affairs being held at venues, have them at the Firehouse, Elks Lodge or VFW. She indicated that changing the venues could result with then putting the savings to better use such as stocking the shelves in the food pantry or being put toward taxes. This then could result in a less amount needed when raising taxes.

<u>Mayor Misciagna</u>: We've talked about this for years and he reminded her that although her husband served as Councilman for six years, it was never voted against when honoring the volunteers in the past. It is a very difficult thing to do. All of those groups that we talked about, when honoring our Police Reserves, they save the town a tremendous amount of money.

Council President Capilli: To put it in perspective, the Police Reserves this year saved the town over \$100,000.00 in tax dollars.

Randi Oppelt: She stated she understood and agreed that the volunteers don't join these groups just knowing it will result in a dinner but spoke about how these events result in being so elaborate.

<u>Council President Capilli</u>: Stated that the Police and Fire Departments within the last few years held their dinners at Old Tappan Manor. Changing the venue resulted in not being so elaborate.

Mayor Misciagna: Stated that in the past the one venue was picked by the Utility Board and paid for from the Utility Board budget and has nothing to do with tax dollars. The Mayor spoke about the one Mayor & Council function that was held consists of sandwiches, held at the Fire Department and nothing elaborate. In general, my attitude has always been – always, if you are to cut one organization you are to cut them all.

Randi Oppelt: She stated "not cut them out, just reduce them". "Still honor the volunteers, use a less expensive venue and use businesses in town to cater these affairs". I understand this is currently being worked on, Councilman Metzdorf has mentioned to me that the Council is trying to reduce the costs.

<u>Council President Capilli</u>: As the Mayor eluded to, when your husband was on the Council for seven years, we would have welcomed any of those suggestions throughout his time here and would have taken them seriously. So, we will continue to do so, and will look for it.

Randi Oppelt: My husband and I are completely separate and he's not involved in this in any way.

Mayor Misciagna: We have had discussions and when times were very difficult we suspended some of the events because of the budget. When I first got on the Council, eight or nine years ago, there was talk about laying people off. At that time, they cut all events out. It was a dire time and I even donated my stipend back to the Borough. When things got back on track, we wanted to reward the volunteers. It's not asked for, but we want to make sure they understand they are appreciated. We will continue to keep things tight and will look for any way to save money. Thank you, Randi, for your comments.

<u>Speaker #2 - Pat Hunt - 2 Mader Place</u>: Asked to get an update on the Sony property stating that "it looks like the building is basically empty".</u>

<u>Mayor Misciagna</u>: It is basically empty. We, as you know, have been in court regarding our housing plan. They are looking to sue us to build a development there, which we are in the process of fighting. As far as an update, we have developed a housing plan. The plan addresses that property but our plan doesn't require that there is any development on that. So it currently is in a Judge's hand right now. You can attend the court, but I don't have much else to say but that we are in the process of fighting that development.

Council President Capilli: The next case management conference is March 4<sup>th</sup> at 3:00 p.m. in Hackensack.

<u>Pat Hunt</u>: Would like to know what is happening and stated that he attended a few Zoning Board meetings and nothing was discussed and one was cancelled on our end and the one last week on their end.

<u>Council President Capilli</u>: Mr. Hunt, Hornrock is on the agenda for March. There was a conflict with the engineering so we had to have a new Engineer to come in because us and Montvale have the same Engineer.

<u>Mayor Misciagna</u>: They are presently in front of the Montvale Planning Board with a plan to develop the Montvale portion of that property. That property is the closest part to the Parkway.

Pat Hunt: More or less the parking lot area?

Mayor Misciagna: Exactly. Go into the property, make a right and that's Montvale.

**Pat Hunt**: Why did they need a variance from us?

Mayor Misciagna: For a lot of reasons. One of them is - that it's complicated, because if they build a building on the parking lot, they make the building that is in Park Ridge non-conforming. Because the parking is required to make the building a conforming building. So, although we have less to say in Montvale, we have concern about whether or not that impacts the property in Park Ridge.

**Pat Hunt:** So, what is our position on granting that variance?

Mayor Misciagna: I cannot speak for the Boards. I can say we want to make sure that it doesn't impact the Park Ridge site.

**Pat Hunt**: Ok. And the Ridgemont Shopping Center – they are obviously doing some testing – what are they...was this spill still from the cleaners that were there years ago contaminating that soil?

Mayor Misciema: I am sure that they have been monitoring those wells for decades.

Pat Hunt: It's almost like they have been sinking a couple more this week.

<u>Mayor Misciagna</u>: I don't think they are additional, I think they are the same wells. I would have to double check, but I think those are the same wells. They come in periodically and they double check everything to see if the plume has moved or anything.

Pat Hunt: And, do we have any reports on that? Do we know what's going on with that?

<u>Mayor Misciagna</u>: Yes, it's under control, they are monitoring it. It's been remediated and they just want to make sure that the contamination isn't spreading. They have been remediating it I think for over twenty years.

Pat Hunt. Thank you.

Speaker #3 – Lori Fredrics – 5 Duke Court: I was the PKRG person that was at the Golden Age Club. I just want to say that I really think that the events that the Golden Age Club have are really important to the seniors. It is really important for their health and their moral. It makes living here as a senior a really important thing. They have weekly meetings and I think it would be an extremely depressing thing to have their four parties in the same place that they have their meetings. Also, my mom was at the Halloween party and she paid to go. So, I think there is a different rate of the people who pay to be members. But, people do pay to go to those parties. It was a normal luncheon, it was nothing extravagant. The people that I met there, included people who were previously on the Council, people who were volunteers for many, many years in Park Ridge and did a lot of amazing things. I met a woman who was an original PKRG person who used to move the gigantic cameras back and forth where needed. We have a Library of things that were filmed over the years including those who contributed a lot to the town. So, I really hope that that would be the last thing that you would cut. Thank you!

Mayor Misciagna: Thanks, Lori. I understand both sides. We are trying to be responsible with the money and I certainly appreciate where you are coming from. It's a difficult thing. Some of those seniors would say, "well we pay taxes a long time". So, it's a small give-back for all of that. I understand your position and I can assure you that we go through the budget with a fine tooth comb and we try to cut where we can. We try to be as responsible as we can. We are not holding these events at The Four Seasons; although a couple years, there were some very nice parties.

**Randi Oppelt**: It's tough times for a lot of people; a lot of people lost their jobs – they struggle to make mortgage payments and to see money spent like this... and that's another thing, everybody I have talked to in town has NO idea that these parties occur.

<u>Mayor Misciagna</u>: They are obviously not volunteers. The moral of the story is – volunteer for your community and come on out and see what we do here. I appreciate the position. I think everybody should be involved with their community - for no matter what it is. Whether it's athletics, the Golden Agers and just comradery, it is important. For the seniors it's nice to be

able to go and interact with your peers. This gives those people that opportunity. Certainly on the other thing like the Fire Department, if we had to have a full-time Fire Department that was paid, it would cost us a lot of money. So, like I said, we will certainly look at that and you have made that very clear, over the last few years, and we always look at it. We always hope that we don't have to cut those. But, if some day we do, we will. Thank you.
