With regards to the rec committee, we just kicked off our summer camp last Thursday. A big thanks again to the Parkridge police department and all our crossing guards for helping making sure the drop off of all the campers and pickup went exceptionally smooth. The summer camp this year is really packed schedule so far, we've already had Carnival day, we had some Inflatables that the kids could play on including a water slide last week. There's already been a trip to the pool to come we have trips to the Westwood movie theater the Montvale bowling alley there's a magic show planned and a DJ and pizza party to close out the Camp. we just had movie night at the Park Ridge Pool, I unfortunately couldn't make it because of a prior engagement but I heard that it was a pretty big success and everybody had fun. I just want to make a note that the rec committee is in full swing with our summer concert series, last Thursday we had our first band come and perform, No Discipline, it was very well attended everybody had a great time. Concerts are every Thursday through I believe it's August 3rd at The Pavilion at Memorial Field at 6 30 every Thursday.

I want to wish Julia all the best and say a little prayer that you remain safe in this job. It's a dangerous job even in a nice little town like ours, so keep her in your thoughts and keep the whole department in your thoughts.
