<u>Metzdorf</u>: To invade our surplus even anymore after taking hundreds of thousands of dollars out of it for the current budget, I believe would be fiscally irresponsible for the town and would create havoc this year and years to follow, so I am voting yes.

Council President Epstein: Thankfully, we will now be able to access the budget and use the funds for everyday operations of the Borough. I would like to speak to Councilmember Fenwick's comments and remind the residents that we provide a lot of services. It was disappointing to see the finance committee present a budget and then the one finance committee member, who presented it and approved it at that point, decided to come out and vote against it. I am very happy with the budget; it has the lowest tax increase in five years. It was unfortunate that we had to go through this process twice and if Councilmember Fenwick had anything in relations to spending that he would have wanted to change, I think that would have been easily addressed. We have used more than enough of our surplus in this budget and will probably need to use it next year to help off set taxes. As residents know, when you have a savings account, you do not deplete your savings but keep funds on reserve for any unforeseen emergencies. I vote yes on the budget and thank the finance committee for their work and our finance professionals agree that this is a very good and responsible budget.

I am always sorry when politics comes into play, because I like to rely on our professionals. I want our resident to know that all our finance professionals, our accountants, and financial advisors, counseled us not to dip into the surplus anymore. It would be irresponsible, and we took as much as we could in good conscious. I want to commend those members who voted yes. Thank you Councilmember Metzdorf for putting the budget together as part of the finance team.

#### **APPROVAL OF MINUTES**

#### REPORTS OF THE GOVERNING BODY

Councilmember Fenwick: We had a meeting of the finance committee this past week. The finance committee discussed the budget that passed tonight. We also got an update form Jeff Bliss, our Borough auditor, regarding to the federal aid money our town we will be receiving, and the various restrictions placed on the town using that money. The Council will need to explore how we could use those funds. Pascack historical society has reopened their museum. Whoever is interested they can go on Sunday and visit it.

#### Councilmember Ferguson:

A growing body of scientific evidence shows that firefighters have an increased risk for cancer compared to the general population. Recent studies have found that firefighters are diagnosed with and die from some types of cancers more often than other men and women in the US. However, while more than two-thirds of US firefighters are volunteers, most of this research has focused on career or paid firefighters. Do cancer risk factors and firefighting-related exposures differ among volunteer firefighters? And if so, how? These are questions that a team of public health researchers at the Rutgers University School of Public Health have set out to answer with the "Firefighter Cancer Assessment & Prevention Study" (CAPS).

The Park Ridge Fire Department (PRFD) is pleased to announce their partnership with CAPS. The PRFD is proudly staffed by approximately forty volunteer firefighters. Like many volunteer fire departments throughout the country the PRFD has rich history of volunteer service that dates back several centuries. When the PRFD was given the opportunity to participate in this study, which will hopefully increase the safety and well being of our current and future members, they quickly jumped at the chance.

The "Firefighter Cancer Assessment & Prevention Study" (CAPS) is led by Dr. Judith Graber, an Associate Professor in the Department of Biostatistics and Epidemiology at the Rutgers University School of Public Health. CAPS works with volunteer fire departments to characterize cancer risk and prevention activities in volunteer firefighters. Ultimately, this research will help scientists and members of the fire service implement long-term risk reduction. CAPS began in 2019 as a feasibility study with Toms River Fire Department, a large volunteer department in Ocean County. Since then, the project has expanded with a 3-year Fire Prevention & Safety Grant from the Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA) and joined an ongoing national study of firefighters, the "Firefighter Cancer Cohort Study" (FFCCS).

Park Ridge Fire Department is now one of eight volunteer fire departments in New Jersey participating in this study. Active members of the department were given the opportunity to enroll in CAPS by completing a comprehensive survey and providing biological samples. Park Ridge Fire Chief Tom Lepore said, "Based on the high percentage of our membership that chose to participate in this study we are happy that we can help in providing meaningful information to further the safety of the volunteer fire service. Additionally, through our participation we are optimistic that we can adapt our current procedures to reduce the risk of cancer to our members."

**Councilmember Cozzi:** I would like to comment on the opening to New Jersey and our local establishments are opening up. Park Ridge is opened and if you are vaccinated and can, please pay homage to our local establishment because it is uplifting to see the barriers removed and stuff opening up. Enjoy yourself at the park and our local facilities.

**Councilmember Capilli:** Congratulations to the sixth graders at the Eastbrook and Westridge Schools. They had their graduation last night and it was heck of a year to get through elementary school, but we wish them the best of luck as the enter middle school in the fall. Officer Stalb retired about a month ago and the Police Department has been actively interviewing, so we should have a new officer to join our Police Department and see on our streets in the near future.

Councilmember Metzdorf: As liaison to the American Legion, I want everyone to know that the Memorial Day Ceremony was run and organized by the American Legion. I would also like to thank all the residents of Park Ridge who attended the ceremony and paid their respect to the dead, it is a true inspiration to see you all there. Commander Bob Oppelt spent weeks finetuning and helping with putting this ceremony to honor the dead together, thank you. I would also like to thank former Commander, Dick Bazzone, who has been doing this for years and years, and who is the heart of the ceremony, for all his hard work putting the ceremony together. Once again, I will plead to the town that the Triboro pantry does need donations. You can drop any donations off at Borough Hall during business hours or twice a week at the Tri Boro between 9-11:00am. As Chair of the finance committee, I truly want to thank the Council for okaying the budget. I truly believe that this is a great budget. I would also like to thank the Department Heads who all came with cuts and no operational increases for all of their hard work.

Council President Epstein: Several of our committees in town are hosting events over the summer. The Recreation Committee is hosting a summer concert series every Thursday evening in the summer form 6:30-8 at the Veteran's Park Gazebo across the train station. There is an eclectic selection of music, form reggae to jazz, every Thursday is a different band. You can also present the summer/dinner concert series flyer to our participating local businesses in July and August from 4:30 to 9pm on Thursday and get 15% discount on your food order. If it is raining, the concerts are moved to the Pavilion behind Davey's field. The Health Department is hosting an educational event, a *Did You Know Series*. The upcoming session will be held June 28<sup>th</sup> at 5pm in the Community Room at Borough Hall and will talk about lead in household items. There will be a representative form the County Health Department and they can even test some of your items. It is an informational session. The Diversity Committee has been meeting. We had our second meeting this past week. We have a good group of people but if anyone else is interested, please contact us, we can always use new members as we start organizing events.

Mayor Misciagna: Last week was a very good week to Park Ridge. We had a great corporate company move into the Hertz Building. PIM Brands Inc is owned by a local guy, Michael

Rosenberg, they have been already very active in the community donating candy. They have already taken 110,000 sq ft of the building and at the opening I attended with Congressman Gottheimer, they said they would explore utilizing more space. It is a great lifeblood of Park Ridge. PIM is starting a new chapter by opening their headquarters in Park Ridge where they currently employ over 120 local residents and its projected expansion will have a great economical impact, thereby ensuring that our Borough remains as vibrant tomorrow as it is today. Also, at Ridgemount, there is a Baba-Ganoush opening, which is a great new addition to our community. The new development downtown already has several retail tenants signed, so we anticipate two restaurants hopefully and some retail. We are talking about coming out of our shells and opening more, I would like residents to know the employees have been working at Borough Hall and w have great projects, like the field and playground. A robust paving program in place after PSEG completes several projects. We are also looking to upgrade the tarin station. We have been working at it with our Borough Administrator and town Historian. If anyone is a tradesman and wants to volunteer some services, please reach out to us. I was happy to start the Diversity Committee and at our last meeting we had about 30 people, but we are always looking to expand and have other interested residents join. Diversity is a strength not a weakness.
