BOROUGH OF PARK RIDGE ORDINANCE NO. 2022-008

CALENDAR YEAR 2022 ORDINANCE TO EXCEED THE MUNICIPAL BUDGET APPROPRIATION LIMITS AND TO ESTABLISH A CAP BANK (N.J.S.A. 40A-4-45.14)

WHEREAS, the Local Government Cap Law, N.J.S. 40A:4-45.1 et seq., provides that in the preparation of its annual budget, a municipality shall limit any increase in said budget up to 2.5% or the cost of living adjustment, whichever is less, unless authorized by ordinance to increase it to 3.5% over the previous year's final appropriations, subject to certain exceptions; and,

WHEREAS, the cost of living adjustment for calendar year 2022 budget is calculated at 2.5% pursuant to N.J.S.A. 40A:4-45.2 and amounts to \$283,364; and

WHEREAS, N.J.S.A. 40A:4-45.15a provides that a municipality may, when authorized by ordinance, appropriate the difference between the amount of its actual final appropriation and the 3.5% percentage rate as an exception to its final appropriations in either of the next two succeeding years; and,

WHEREAS, the Borough Council of the Borough of Park Ridge in the County of Bergen finds it's advisable and necessary to increase its CY 2022 budget by up to 3.5% over the previous year's final appropriations, in the interest of promoting the health, safety and welfare of the citizens; and,

WHEREAS, the Borough Council hereby determines that an additional 2.5% increase in the budget of said year, amounting to \$113,345 in excess of the increase in final appropriations otherwise permitted by the Local Government Cap Law, is advisable and necessary; and,

WHEREAS, the Borough Council hereby determines that any amount authorized hereinabove that is not appropriated as part of the final budget shall be retained as an exception to final appropriation in either of the next two succeeding years.

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT ORDAINED, by the Borough Council of the Borough of Park Ridge, in the County of Bergen, a majority of the full authorized membership of this governing body affirmatively concurring, that, in the 2022 budget year, the final appropriations of the Borough of Park Ridge shall, in accordance with this ordinance and N.J.S.A. 40A:4-45.14, be increased by 3.5%, amounting to \$396,709, and that the 2022 municipal budget for the Borough of Park Ridge be approved and adopted in accordance with this ordinance; and,

BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED, that any amount authorized hereinabove that is not appropriated as part of the final budget shall be retained as an exception to final appropriation in either of the next two succeeding years; and,

BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED, that a certified copy of this ordinance as introduced be filed with the Director of the Division of Local Government Services within 5 days of introduction; and,

BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED, that a certified copy of this ordinance upon adoption, with the recorded vote included thereon, be filed with said Director within 5 days after such adoption.

BOROUGH OF PARK RIDGE ORDINANCE NO. 2022-005

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING CHAPTER 55A OF THE CODE OF THE BOROUGH OF PARK RIDGE, NEW JERSEY ENTITLED AN ORDINANCE ESTABISHING ELECTIC RATES AND CREATING THEM IN CHAPTER 55A OF THE ORDINANCE OF THE BOROUGH OF PARK RIDGE

WHEREAS, the Mayor and Council have been advised and based upon increases in the cost of power that the electric rates for all electric service in the Borough of Park Ridge have to be increased; and

WHEREAS, the Mayor and Council have carefully considered these recommendations and reviewed all of the appropriate supporting documentation; and

WHEREAS, the Mayor and Council agree that this rate increase is in the best interest of the users of the electric supply system; and

WHEREAS, the electric rates in effect were established on November 27, 2007.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED by the Mayor and Council of the Borough of Park Ridge as follows:

Section I: Chapter 55A of the Code of the Borough of Park Ridge is hereby amended to read as follows for all electric bills rendered as of May 1, 2022:

Section II - Residential Service

a. Availability

This service is available to the customers located on the Borough's distribution lines who desire service for household and other related uses in a single private dwelling or an individual dwelling unit in a multiple dwelling structure and its a appurtenant detached buildings.

b. Character of Service

The service provided shall be alternating current, nominal frequency 60 hertz (cycles per second). Single phase: 120 volts, 2 wire: 120/208 volts, 3 wire; 120/240 volts, 3 wire; and three (3) phase: 120/240 volts, 4 wire or 120/208 volts, 4 wire.

c. Rate

The charges for electrical use are computed and billed on a bi-monthly basis for service used. The monthly rates are:

d. Minimum Monthly Charge

The minimum charge shall be an amount equal to the customer charge but not less than six Dollars and fifty Cents (\$6.50).

e. Payment Terms

Bills are due payable when rendered. If unpaid at the end of twenty-five (25) days, the Board of Public Works reserve the right to terminate service following suitable written notice.

f. Special Provisions

(1) Owners o record o property within the Borough of Park Ridge shall not be required to pay a deposit. All others shall be required to pay a deposit based upon estimated bills which would accrue for two and one-half months' service. The Board of Public works shall have the right to increase the amount of a deposit if in its judgment such action is necessary.

Section C - Rates for Electric Service - Heat

a. Availability

This service is available to all customers located on the Borough's distribution lines and desiring services for household and other related uses in a single private dwelling, or an individual dwelling unit in a multiple dwelling structure, and its appurtenant detached buildings.

b. Character of Service

The type of service shall be alternating current, 60 cycle. Single phase: 120 volts, 2 wire; 120/208 volts, 3 wire; 120/240 volts, 3 wire; and three (3) phase: 120/240 volts, 4 wire or 120/208 volts, 4 wire.

c. Billing

All heating customers are billed monthly for electric usage.

d. The Monthly Rate for Heat shall be:

Customer Charge......\$6.50

Energy Charge: All KWH......\$0.15287

The Adjustment Clause shall be applied to all KWH supplied under this rate.

e. Minimum Monthly Charge

The minimum monthly charge shall be an amount equal to the customer charge per month but not less than six Dollars and fifty Cents (\$6.50).

f. Payment Terms

The bills are due when rendered. If the bill is not paid within twenty-five (25) days, The Board of Public Works reserves the right to terminate service following suitable written notice.

g. Special Provisions

(1) Owners of record of property within the Borough of Park Ridge shall not be required to pay a deposit. All tenants are required to pay a security deposit. Such deposit will be held until the premises are vacated and all final bills are paid in full. Interest on the deposit is applied to the account once a year. The Board of Public Works shall have the right to increase the amount of the deposit if in its judgment such action is necessary.

Section III - Senior Citizen, Lifeline and Disability Service

a. Applicability

This rate shall be applicable to the use of service for private residential purposes when the following criteria and conditions are met:

- 1) Senior Citizens Customers must be at least 65 years of age; of
- Lifeline Customer must be listed on the Schedule of eligible customers established by the Commissioner of the Department of Human Services pursuant to N.J.S.A 48:2-29.16; or
- Disability Customer must present a physician's certificate verifying customer's permanent and total disability of a copy of the Social Security Award Certificate form No. SS A-30 to demonstrate disability;
- 4) A customer who satisfies the criteria of subsection (1), (2) or (3) above and who meets all of the conditions of this subsection (4) shall be eligible for the appropriate rate.
 - A. Customer must have an income not to exceed the State of New Jersey tax-exemption qualification level from all sources, taxable and non-taxable, but not including Social Security; and

- B. Total income of all persons who reside in customer's household from all sourced, taxable and non-taxable, but not including Social Security shall not exceed Six Thousand (\$6,000.00) Dollars per annum; and
- Borough Tax Collector shall be he enforcing agent and shall annually certify those residents eligible for the Senior Citizens, Lifeline and Disability Rate; and
- 6) The rate shall be effective only upon application to and approval by the Borough Tax Collector in its sole and complete discretion as to qualification hereunder.
- Any of the above limits and qualifications may be modified or changed by proper resolution of the Board of Public Works on a showing of good cause.

b. Character of Service

Alternating current, 60 cycle. Single phase: 120/208 volts, 2 wire; 120/208 volts, 3 wire; 120/240 volts, 3 wire.

c. Billing

Charges are computed and billed bi-monthly for services taken.

d. Monthly Rate

The Adjustment Clause shall be applied to all KWH supplied under this rate.

e. Minimum Monthly Charge

The Minimum Monthly Charge shall be an amount equal to the Customer Charge but not less than three Dollars and twenty-five Cents (\$3.25).

f. Payment Terms

Bills are due and payable when rendered. If unpaid at the end of twenty-five (25) days, the Board of Public Works reserve the right to terminate service following suitable written notice.

g. Special Provisions

(1) Owners of record of property within the Borough of Park Ridge shall not be required to pay a deposit. All others shall be required to pay a deposit based upon estimated bills which would accrue for two and one-half months' services. The Board of Public Works shall have the right to increase the amount of a deposit if in its judgment such action is necessary.

Section IV - General Service

a. Availability

Available to non-residential customers located on the Borough's Distribution Lines desiring electric service for general lighting and/or power service and whose maximum billing demand is not more than 25 KW. All such service shall be taken through one meter.

b. Character of Service

Alternating current, 60 cycle. Single phase: 120/240 volts, 3 wire; and three phase: 120/240 volts, 4 wire; 240 volts, 3 wire; or 120/208 volts, 4 wire and where existing facilities permit, 277/480 volts, 4 wire may be supplied.

c. Billing

Charges are computed and billed on a monthly basis with monthly payments for service taken.

d. Monthly Rate

The Customer's monthly bill shall be the sum of the demand and energy charges.

Customer Charges: Including first 3KW demand....\$29.25 Demand Charge: All KW above 3KW demand.....\$14.43 Energy Charge: All KWH......\$0.12643 The Adjustment Clause shall be applied to all KWH supplied under this

e. Minimum Monthly Charge

The minimum monthly charge shall be an amount equal to the customer charge but not less than. twenty-nine Dollars and twenty-five Cents (\$29.25).

g. Determination of Demand

The Demand will be determined at the option of the Board of Public Works by estimate or by test at the time of maximum use or by Demand meter measurement. When measured by indicating meters the Demand shall be the highest fifteen (15) minutes Demand in kilowatts used during the month.

h. Payment Terms

Bills are due and payable when rendered. If unpaid at the end of twentyfive (25) days, the Board of Public Works reserves the right to terminate services following suitable written notice.

i. Special Provisions

Owners of record of property within the Borough of Park Ridge shall not be required to pay a deposit. All others shall be required to pay a deposit based on at least two and a half times the estimated monthly bill. In no case shall a deposit be less than \$300.00.

Section V - Large Power Service

a. Availability

Availability to customers located on the Borough's Distribution Lines desiring electric service for general and/or power service and whose minimum billing demand is not less than twenty-five (25) kilowatts.

b. Character of Service

Alternating current, 60 cycle. Single phase: 120/240 volts, 3 wire; and three phase: 120/240 volts, 4 wire; 240 volts, 3 wire; or 120/208 volts, 4 wire and where existing facilities permit, 277/480 volts, 4 wire may be supplied

c. Billing

Charges are computed and billed on a monthly basis with monthly payments for service taken.

d. Monthly Rate

The customer's monthly bill shall be the sum of the demand and energy charges.

Demand Charge:

All KW.....\$16.54

Energy Charge: All KWH......\$ 0.12395

The Adjustment Clause shall be applied to all KWH supplied under this rate.

e. Minimum Monthly Charge

The Minimum Monthly Charge shall be an amount equal to the Demand Charge but shall be equivalent to not less than twenty-five (25) KW of Demand.

f. Determination of Demand

The Demand shall be determined by recording or indication meters. When measured by indicating meters the Demand shall be the highest fifteen (15) minutes Demand in kilowatts used during the month.

g. Payment Terms

Bills are due and payable when rendered. If unpaid at the end of twenty-five (25) days, the Board of Public Works reserve the right to terminate service following suitable written notice.

h. Special Provisions

Owners of record of property within the Borough of Park Ridge shall not be required to pay a deposit. All others shall be required to pay a deposit based on at least two and a half times the estimated monthly bill. In no case shall a deposit be less than \$1,000.00.

DUSK TO DAWN FLOOD LIGHT SERVICE

e. Minimum Monthly Charge

f. Payment Terms

Bills are due and payable when rendered. If unpaid at the end of twenty-five (25) days, the Board of Public Works reserves the right to terminate service following suitable written notice.

Section VIII - Adjustment Clause

An adjustment clause shall be applied to each kilowatt-hour (KWH) supplied under all rate schedules. This adjustment clause determined to the nearest \$0.00001 in accordance with the formula set forth below shall be applied to all kilowatt-hours supplied during the billing period. It shall be determined on an annual basis, but may be revised periodically during the course of the year by the Board of Public works upon a showing of good cause.

If any section, subsection, paragraph, sentence or other of this ordinance is adjudged unconstitutional or invalid, such judgment shall not affect or invalidate the reminder of this ordinance, but shall be confirmed in its effect to the section, subsection, paragraph, sentence or other part of this ordinance directly involved in the controversy in which said judgment shall have been rendered and all other provisions of this ordinance shall remain in full force and effect.

Section XI - Severability

If any section, part of any section, or clause or phrase of this ordinance is for any reason held to be invalid or unconstitutional, such decision shall not affect the remaining provisions of this Ordinance. AN ORDINANCE AMENDING CHAPTER 98 OF THE CODE OF THE BOROUGH OF PARK RIDGE, NEW JERSEY ENTITLED

AN ORDINANCE ESTABLISHING WATER RATES WITHIN THE BOROUGH OF PARK RIDGE AND SO MUCH OF THE BOROUGH OF WOODCLIFF LAKE SERVICED BY THE PARK RIDGE WATER DEPARTMENT

WHEREAS, the Mayor and Council have received the recommendation of the Park Ridge Board of Public Works to implement a rate increase for the service of water within the Borough Park Ridge and so much of the Borough of Woodcliff Lake serviced by the Park Ridge Water Department; and

WHEREAS, the Mayor and Council have carefully considered these recommendations and reviewed all of the appropriate supporting documentation; and

WHEREAS, the Mayor and Council agree with the Park Ridge Board of Public Works that this rate increase is in the best interest of the users of the water supply system; and

 $\ensuremath{\mathbf{WHEREAS}}$, the last water rate increase was implemented on January 1, 2020,

NOW THEREFORE BE IT ORDAINED by the Mayor and Council of the Borough Park Ridge as follows:

SECTION ONE: Chapter 98-2 of the Code of the Borough of Park Ridge is hereby amended to read as follows:

98-2 WATER RATES.

- 1. The following rates are hereby fixed for the sale of water by the Park Ridge Water Department within the Borough of Park Ridge and so much of the Borough of Woodcliff Lake as is serviced by the Borough of Park Ridge Water Department effective for all water bills rendered as of May 1, 2022:
- 2. Meter Service Rates. Whenever the term "fixed charge" is used in this Ordinance, said fixed charge shall be in addition to any applicable charges for water consumption:
- A) General Meter Service. This rate shall be applicable to use of water supplied through meters.
 - a. Fixed Charge does not include any water consumption.

b. Meter Rates - for each gallon consumed during quarter per \$5.06 per 1,000 gallons. This rate includes the State Water Tax pursuant to L. 1983, c. 443.

- B) General Metered Service Senior Citizens. This rate shall be applied to use of water supplied through residential meters when the following criteria and conditions are met:
 - (1) Customer must be at least 65 years of age or totally disabled.
- (2) Customer's household income which is that total income earned by all residents of that household is not to exceed twenty-five thousand (\$25,000) Dollars from all sources taxable and non-taxable, but not including Social Security.
- (3) Customer must qualify for Senior Citizen State Tax Exemption of real property or for the state regulated Lifeline Program.
 - (4) All senior citizens to be recertified annually.
 - (5) The Chief Financial Officer shall be the enforcing agent.

Senior Citizen Rates shall be as follows:

BOROUGH OF PARK RIDGE ORDINANCE NO. 2022-007

BOND ORDINANCE TO AUTHORIZE THE ACQUISITION AND INSTALLATION OF WATER TREATMENT SYSTEMS AT VARIOUS PUBLIC WATER SUPPLY FACILITIES IN, BY AND FOR THE WATER UTILITY OF THE BOROUGH OF PARK RIDGE, IN THE COUNTY OF BERGEN, STATE OF NEW JERSEY, TO APPROPRIATE THE SUM OF \$2,200,000 TO PAY THE COST THEREOF, TO MAKE A DOWN PAYMENT, TO AUTHORIZE THE ISSUANCE OF BONDS TO FINANCE SUCH APPROPRIATION AND TO PROVIDE FOR THE ISSUANCE OF BOND ANTICIPATION NOTES IN ANTICIPATION OF THE ISSUANCE OF SUCH BONDS.

BE IT ORDAINED by the Borough Council of the Borough of Park Ridge, in the County of Bergen, State of New Jersey, as follows:

Section 1. The Borough of Park Ridge, in the County of Bergen, State of New Jersey (the "Borough") is hereby authorized to acquire and install water treatment systems at various public water supply facilities in, by and for the Water Utility of the Borough. Said improvements shall include all work, materials and appurtenances necessary and suitable therefor.

Section 2. The sum of \$2,200,000 is hereby appropriated to the payment of the cost of making the improvements described in Section 1 hereof (hereinafter referred to as "purpose"). Said appropriation shall be met from the proceeds of the sale of the bonds authorized and the down payment appropriated by this ordinance. Said improvements shall be made as general improvements and no part of the cost thereof shall be assessed against property specially benefited.

Section 3. It is hereby determined and stated that (1) said purpose is not a current expense of said Borough, and (2) it is necessary to finance said purpose by the issuance of obligations of said Borough pursuant to the Local Bond Law (Chapter 2 of Title 40A of the New Jersey Statutes Annotated, as amended; the "Local Bond Law"), and (3) the total estimated cost of said purpose is \$2,200,000, and (4) \$105,000 of said sum is to be provided by the down payment hereinafter appropriated to finance said purpose, and (5) the estimated maximum amount of bonds or notes necessary to be issued for said purpose is \$2,095,000, and (6) the cost of such purpose, as hereinbefore stated, includes the aggregate amount of \$300,000 which is estimated to be necessary to finance the cost of such purpose, including architect's fees, accounting, engineering and inspection costs, legal expenses and other expenses, including interest on such obligations to the extent permitted by Section 20 of the Local Bond Law.

Section 4. It is hereby determined and stated that moneys exceeding \$105,000, appropriated for down payments on capital improvements or for the capital improvement fund in Water Utility budgets heretofore adopted for said Borough, are now available to finance said purpose. The sum of \$105,000 is hereby appropriated from such moneys to the payment of the cost of said purpose.

Section 5. To finance said purpose, bonds of said Borough of an aggregate principal amount not exceeding \$2,095,000 are hereby authorized to be issued pursuant to the Local Bond Law. Said bonds shall bear interest at a rate per annum as may be hereafter determined within the limitations prescribed by law. All matters with respect to said bonds not determined by this ordinance shall be determined by resolutions to be hereafter adopted.

Section 6. To finance said purpose, bond anticipation notes of said Borough of an aggregate principal amount not exceeding \$2,095,000 are hereby authorized to be issued pursuant to the Local Bond Law in anticipation of the issuance of said bonds. In the event that bonds are issued pursuant to this ordinance, the aggregate amount of notes hereby authorized to be issued shall be reduced by an amount equal to the principal amount of the bonds so issued. If the aggregate amount of outstanding bonds and notes issued pursuant to this ordinance shall at any time exceed the sum first mentioned in this section, the moneys raised by the issuance of said bonds shall, to not less than the amount of such excess, be applied to the payment of such notes then outstanding.

Section 7. Each bond anticipation note issued pursuant to this ordinance shall be dated on or about the date of its issuance and shall be payable not more than one year from its date, shall bear interest at a rate per annum as may be hereafter determined within the limitations prescribed by law and may be renewed from time to time pursuant to and within limitations prescribed by the Local Bond Law. Each of said bond anticipation notes shall be signed by the Mayor and by a financial officer and shall be under the seal of said Borough and attested by the Borough Clerk or Deputy Borough Clerk. Said officers are hereby authorized to execute said notes in such form as they may adopt in conformity with law. The power to determine any matters with respect to said notes not determined by this ordinance and also the power to sell said notes, is hereby delegated to the Chief Financial Officer who is hereby authorized to sell said notes either at one time or from time to time in the manner provided by law.

Section 8. It is hereby determined and declared that the period of usefulness of said purpose, according to its reasonable life, is a period of twenty years computed from the date of said bonds.

Section 9. It is hereby determined and stated that the Supplemental Debt Statement required by the Local Bond Law has been duly made and filed in the office of the Borough Clerk of said Borough, and that such statement so filed shows that the gross debt of said Borough, as defined in Section 43 of the Local Bond Law, is increased by this ordinance by \$2,095,000 and that the issuance of the bonds and notes authorized by this ordinance will be within all debt limitations prescribed by said Local Bond Law.

Section 10. Any funds received from private parties, the County of Bergen, the State of New Jersey or any of their agencies or any funds received from the United States of America or any of its agencies in aid of such purpose, shall be applied to the payment of the cost of such purpose, or, if bond anticipation notes have been issued, to the payment of the bond anticipation notes, and the amount of bonds authorized for such purpose shall be reduced accordingly.

Section 11. The capital budget is hereby amended to conform with the provisions of this ordinance to the extent of any inconsistency therewith and the resolutions promulgated by the Local Finance Board showing full detail of the amended capital budget and capital program as approved by the Director, Division of Local Government Services, is on file with the Borough Clerk and is available for public inspection.

Section 12. The Borough intends to issue the bonds or notes to finance the cost of the improvements described in Section 1 of this bond ordinance. If the Borough incurs such costs prior to the issuance of the bonds or notes, the Borough hereby states its reasonable expectation to reimburse itself for such expenditures with the proceeds of such bonds or notes in the maximum principal amount of bonds or notes authorized by this bond ordinance.

Section 13. The full faith and credit of the Borough are hereby pledged to the punctual payment of the principal of and the interest on the obligations authorized by this ordinance. Said obligations shall be direct, unlimited and general obligations of the Borough, and the Borough shall levy ad valorem taxes upon all the taxable real property within the Borough for the payment of the principal of and interest on such bonds and notes, without limitation as to rate or amount.

Section 14. This ordinance shall take effect twenty days after the first publication thereof after final passage.

RESOLUTION OF THE BOROUGH COUNCIL OF THE BOROUGH OF PARK RIDGE, IN THE COUNTY OF BERGEN, NEW JERSEY, COVENANTING TO COMPLY WITH THE PROVISIONS OF THE INTERNAL REVENUE CODE OF 1986, AS AMENDED, APPLICABLE TO THE EXCLUSION FROM GROSS INCOME FOR FEDERAL INCOME TAX PURPOSES OF INTEREST ON OBLIGATIONS ISSUED BY THE BOROUGH OF PARK RIDGE, AUTHORIZING THE MAYOR, BOROUGH CLERK, ACTING CHIEF FINANCIAL OFFICER AND OTHER BOROUGH OFFICIALS TO TAKE SUCH ACTION AS THEY MAY DEEM NECESSARY OR ADVISABLE TO EFFECT SUCH COMPLIANCE AND DESIGNATING A \$6,716,000 ANTICIPATION NOTE, DATED APRIL 29, 2022, PAYABLE APRIL 28, 2023, AS A "QUALIFIED TAX-EXEMPT OBLIGATION" PURSUANT TO SECTION 265(b)(3) OF THE INTERNAL REVENUE CODE OF 1986, AS AMENDED.

WHEREAS, the Borough of Park Ridge, in the County of Bergen, New Jersey (the "Borough") from time to time issues bonds, notes and other obligations, the interest on which is excluded from gross income for Federal income tax purposes, and desires to take such action as may be necessary or advisable to establish and maintain such exclusion; and

WHEREAS, the Internal Revenue Code of 1986, as amended (the "Code"), contains provisions with respect to the exclusion from gross income for Federal income tax purposes of interest on obligations, including provisions, among others, which require issuers of tax-exempt obligations, such as the Borough to account for and rebate certain arbitrage earnings to the United States Treasury and to take other action to establish and maintain such Federal tax exclusion; and

WHEREAS, the Borough intends to issue a \$6,716,000 bond anticipation note, dated April 29, 2022, payable April 28, 2023 (the "Note"); and

WHEREAS, the Borough desires to designate the Note as a "qualified tax-exempt obligation" pursuant to Section 265(b)(3) of the Code;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Borough Council of the Borough of Park Ridge, in the County of Bergen, New Jersey, as follows: SECTION 1. The Borough Council hereby covenants on behalf of the Borough, to the extent permitted by the Constitution and the laws of the State of New Jersey, to do and perform all acts and things permitted by law and necessary to assure that interest paid on bonds, notes and other obligations of the Borough (including the Note) be and remain excluded from gross income of the owners thereof for Federal income tax purposes pursuant to Section 103 of the Code.

SECTION 2. The Mayor, Borough Clerk, Acting Chief Financial Officer and the other officials of the Borough are hereby authorized and directed to take such action, make such representations and give such assurances as they may deem necessary or advisable to effect compliance with the Code.

SECTION 3. The Note is hereby designated as a "qualified tax-exempt obligation" for the purpose of Section 265(b)(3) of the Code.

SECTION 4. It is hereby determined and stated that (1) said Note is not a "private activity bond" as defined in the Code and (2) the Borough and its subordinate entities, if any, do not reasonably anticipate issuing in excess of \$10 million of new money tax-exempt obligations (other than private activity bonds) during the calendar year 2022.

SECTION 5. It is further determined and stated that the Borough has not, as of the date hereof, issued any tax-exempt obligations (other than the Note) during the calendar year 2022.

SECTION 6. The Borough will, to the best of its ability, attempt to comply with respect to the limitations on issuance of tax-exempt obligations pursuant to Section 265(b)(3) of the Code; however, said Borough does not covenant to do so, and hereby expressly states that a covenant is not made hereby.

<u>SECTION 7</u>. The issuing officers of the Borough are hereby authorized to deliver a certified copy of this resolution to the original purchaser of the Note and to further provide such original purchaser with a certificate of obligations issued during the calendar year 2022 dated as of the date of delivery of the Note.

<u>SECTION 8</u>. This resolution shall take effect immediately upon its adoption.
